

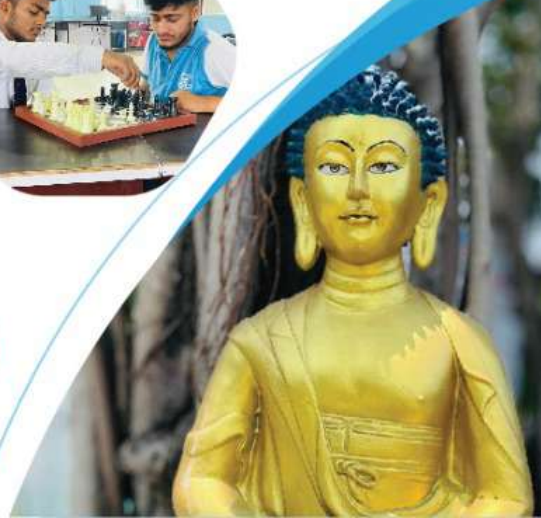

(MBS)

Masters in Business Studies

Program Objectives



The objective of the MBS program is to enable the students to work as competent managers and to meet the demand for higher-level managers in organizations, particularly in the functional areas of management. Upon graduation, a student should be able to function as a manager in business, industry, government, and non-government sectors, within and outside the country, in areas like accounting, marketing, finance, and general management.

Through the two-year (60) credit hours program students develop their knowledge and management skills based on a good understanding of the economic, social, and political milieu both at the national and global levels.

Curricular Structure

The MBS program is a four-semester (two-year) program with three key components:

- (1) Core courses
- (2) Specialization courses
- (3) Dissertation



1. Core Courses

Core business courses integrate all analytical and functional areas and provide students with an appreciation of the diversity and inter-relationship of business and management issues. It includes subjects such as Research Methodology, Statistical Methods, Managerial Economics, Organizational Behavior, Human Resources Management, Managerial Finance, Management Accountancy, Accounting for Financial and Managerial Decision and Control, Marketing Management, Production and Operations Management, International Business, Entrepreneurship, Strategic Management, and Business Environment.

2. Specialization Courses

Specialization in any one of the areas, such as Accounting, Finance, Marketing, and Management enables the student to develop expertise in his/her concentration area.

3. Dissertation

The MBS program requires students to conduct original research work during the four semesters of the two-year study period. Students are required to write a dissertation based on their original research work.

Eligibility Conditions for Admission

The students applying for admission to the MBS course must have successfully completed the BBS program or a Bachelors degree in any discipline from Tribhuvan University or from any other university recognized by Tribhuvan University.

Admission Procedure

The selection of students shall be based on CMAT. The test shall be based on the GMAT and GRE format. The admission test shall concentrate on testing verbal and quantitative ability, business and economics, logical reasoning, and general awareness. There shall be altogether hundred (100) questions in the CMAT containing 20 questions in each section. Students must secure a minimum of 40 percent in the CMAT to qualify for admission.



Teaching Pedagogy

The MBS program is based on the student-centered learning approach. The general teaching methodology of the program includes interactive lectures, student presentations, case studies, guest lectures, and projects. The teaching faculty shall determine the appropriate teaching-learning methods suitable for each course.

Attendance

This program demands a very high level of commitment from students. Students are required to attend regularly all classes and presentations as required by the course. Students failing to attend 80 % of classes shall not be allowed to appear in the semester-end examinations.

Examination and Evaluation

The performance of students will be evaluated through ongoing in-semester evaluations and semester-end examinations. The FOM shall have the final authority in conducting, evaluating, and awarding grades in semester-end examinations. The course facilitator (instructor) shall decide the grades in the in-semester evaluations. A student is required to pass the internal and external examinations independently.

In-semester Evaluations

The in-semester (internal) evaluation shall generally have a total weight of 40 percent in each course. Students have to secure at least 50 percent marks in each subject to pass the in-semester exam. The concerned faculty shall be responsible for the continuous in-semester evaluations. The in-semester evaluation shall be based on a student's performance in class presentations, case analyses, and project assignments, class tests, and others as required by the course. A student must secure a minimum Grade Point Average (GPA) of 2.7 or Grade B minus (B-) in a course to be eligible to appear in the semester-end examination of that course.





Semester-end Examinations

The semester-end examinations on course work related subjects shall have a total weight of 60 percent. The semester-end examination shall be based on problem-solving questions, analytical questions, and case studies or any other formats as demanded by a course. The duration of the examination shall be 3 hours for each course.

Grading System

The grading system followed in the MBS program will be based on the absolute performance of a student in the in-semester evaluations and semester-end examinations. The performance of a student in the MBS program shall be made on a four-point scale ranging from 0 to 4. The passing grade in the semester-end examination for an individual paper shall be a grade of "B minus" or a GPA of 2.7. To pass the semester examination, the student must secure a minimum of Grade "B" or a Cumulative Grade Point Average (CGPA) of 3.0 (60 percent). The overall grade of a student will be determined by the student's performance in the in-semester and semester-end examinations.

Discipline and integrity

Vishwa Adarsha College has the basic principles of reasonability and rationality of reward and punishment. It attaches great importance to discipline and the same must be scrupulously observed by all students. Failure to comply with any of the rules, regulations, or requirements notified from time to time will lead to strict disciplinary action. The college believes that quality education comes with civilized students. It maintains a high standard of discipline and never compromises any breach of it.

- ◆ Students must attend lectures, practicals/tutorials regularly and punctually.
- ◆ Students have to wear the proper uniform prescribed by the college and should have a neat haircut.
- ◆ The college takes attendance of the students twice a day.
- ◆ A minimum of seventy percent attendance for annual courses and 80% for semester courses is required to be eligible for the annual examinations.
- ◆ Students must enter and leave the college at a specified time.
- ◆ Students are prohibited from bringing non-academic materials and articles such as a mobile, CD, magazine, digital camera, and motorbike.
- ◆ Smoking, consumption of alcoholic drinks, and the use of narcotics is strictly prohibited in any part of the college including the canteen.
- ◆ Students must not loiter in the corridors when classes are in progress.
- ◆ Students must take proper care of the college property. Any damage done to the property of the college is a serious offense. Any such damage (e.g., disfiguring walls, doors, breaking furniture, electrical fittings, etc.) will have to be repaired by paying the cost of damage by those responsible for the damage. Disciplinary action will be taken against those students damaging any college property.
- ◆ Any student who a) is persistently insubordinate; b) is willfully mischievous; c) uses foul/abusive language; d) defaces the walls or damages any property within the premises; e) is likely to have an unwholesome effect on other students or detrimental to the smooth and orderly conduct of the college. f) is repeatedly found guilty of fraud/malpractices in tests/exams is liable to be expelled, either temporarily or permanently, depending on the nature and seriousness of the offense.
- ◆ Every bonafide student of the college must wear the identity card at all times when he/she is in the college campus.
- ◆ Students must read the general and classified notices displayed on the Notice Boards from time to time. Ignorance of any information put up on the notice board will not be accepted as an excuse.

An adequate collection of text/reference books, journals, periodicals, magazines, newspapers, handouts prepared by the faculties, and books related to literature, history, and philosophy are available in it. The library remains open from 6.15 a.m. to 4.00 p.m. on all working days and on holidays as per requirement. The different subject sections are well displayed, and every student is encouraged to make the best use of the library and reading room. The library is equipped with an internet facility. The reading space has a seating capacity of 30 with separate arrangements for faculty and internet browsing.

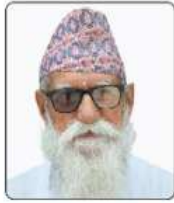
